Transfer Credits

The University of Regina recognizes the AP exams indicated in the chart for the corresponding transfer credits. A grade of 4 or better must be achieved on the AP exam to be considered for transfer credit. Students must request their official grades to be sent from the College Board directly to the U of R for transfer credit consideration.
